TANGO CULTURE

There should be very few things that define so clearly the "porteño" culture as TANGO does. Watch a tango street show at **Caminito, La Boca** neighborhood. Beautiful local area where the houses are full of colors and handcraft exhibits are all over where.

SHARE MATE

MATE can be drunk among friends or alone, with the peculiarity that everyone drinks out of the same mate gourd. Using the same bombilla straw. If you want to buy your MATE KIT go to: Todo Mates at Palermo Soho for your mate & bombilla. Then buy yerba at any market. Good label: PLAYADITO

"DULCE DE LECHE"

Spend a morning at the classic Cafe Tortoni and have the best churros with dulce de leche in town or try our super local cake CHOCOTORTA: Pani DELI has a good one!

For another wonderful experience with dulce de leche try **CACHAFAZ ALFAJOR** or **GUOLIS ALFAJOR** at any drugstore. It's really awesome.

Or also another variety of our pastry with DDL are the "cañoncitos with DDL". Stop at any bakery to taste this stuff.

Please don't go home without buying at a local supermarket DULCE DE LECHE. It's a very good present for anyone! **Good labels:** La Salamandra, Chimbote, La Serenisima. Dulce de leche & Co store at Palermo Soho has lot of brands also!





ASADO RITUAL

For Argentinians the art of lighting the barbecue is passed down from generation to generation. Every Argentine should be able to debate techniques, cuts and cooking levels. For that reason asking a porteño to explain how to do barbecue is nigh on impossible. The parrilla is at the centre of every party or family gathering and every neighborhood has a barbecue restaurant for those who cant perform the ritual at home.

Don Julio is one of the best restos in town at Palermo Soho area to eat ASADO. Usually is has lots of people waiting. So we recommend to go with extra time. Plan B: La Cabrera, Rio Alba & Lo de Jesus

But if you wanna have a full local experience don't miss the Argentinian Cantina: EL OBRERO at La Boca neighborhood is fabulous! Argentinian meat & the FLAN with dulce de leche as a dessert are so good!

Here we also tell you some special tips to order at a barbecue resto!

Starters: Morcilla, chorizo, empanada or if you like cheese have a provoleta. Special cuts at any ASADO restaurant: Entraña, bife de chorizo, asado or vacio.

Dessert: Dulce & batata, DDL pancake or our typical FLAN with DDL & cream.

CHORIPAN

On CHORI resto at Palermo Soho area. Taste CHIMICHURRI sauce. This sauce is a mix of delicious herbs & spices such as parsley, oregano, red pepper, garlic, salt, wine vinegar, pepper and oil.

MINUTAS!

Local ready to eat meals are called MINUTAS. You can get them in bar & restaurant. The most popular ones are the so called "milanesas"(breaded steaks) with french fries. El Preferido de Palermo resto has spectacular MII ANESAS.

Last but not least...

FERNET WITH COCA COLA!

You should go to LA FERNETERIA and try the best FERNET with coca in town. That a typical Argentinian drink.





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
